3. What were TWO advantages of each side in the American War for Independence?
4. Explain the idea of “natural rights” that influenced the signers of the Declaration of Independence.
5. How did the defeat of the British at Saratoga help the colonists eventually win the war?
6. Explain how the Continental Army “held it together after all” at Valley Forge in the winter of 1777-1778.
7. What was Burgoyne’s Plan in 1777? Why did it fail?
