Any selection of these questions could appear on the examination. They are short response questions, NOT essay questions.

Theme: Change

The ideas and beliefs of philosophers and leaders have led to changes in nations and regions.

For any of: **Socrates, Plato, Hippocrates, Aristotle, Jesus, Paul**

- Explain a major area of belief of that philosopher or leader
- Discuss how that idea or belief changed a nation or region.

Theme: Change

Throughout history, the actions of leaders have changed the society in which they lived.

For any of: **Pericles, Alexander, Julius Caesar, Marcus Aurelius, Constantine, Clovis, and/or Charlemagne**

- Describe one situation the leader attempted to change
- Describe one action the leader took to change the situation
- Discuss the impact of that action on the society in which the leader lived

Theme: Conflict

Conflicts between groups of people have threatened peace in many nations and regions.

For any of: **Persian War, Peloponnesian War, Conquests of Alexander, Punic Wars, Barbarian Invasions into Rome and/or Medieval Europe**

- Discuss the historical circumstances that led to the conflict
- Analyze the effect of this conflict on the TWO groups involved.

Theme: Economic Systems

Societies have developed different economic systems for many reasons. Some of these economic systems include Manorialism, capitalism, and communism.

For **Manorialism**:

- Discuss the historical circumstances surrounding the development of the economic system.
- Describe two features of the system.
- Evaluate the impact of the economic system on this society during a specific historical period.

Theme: Turning Points

Turning points are major events in history that have led to lasting change.

For any of the following turning points: **Alexander's Conquests, Rome Adopts Christianity, Pope Crowns Charlemagne Emperor:**

- Describe the historical circumstances surrounding the turning point.
- Explain how the turning point changed the course of history.
