READING



Book Test — Read an approved work of historical fiction and take the test in “Accelerated Reader” computer program.

Historical Documents — Read and examine primary source documents from the time period you’re studying. Complete interpretation form.

Book Report — Read an approved work of historical fiction and write a book report. Report includes a 5-minute interview with teacher.

PERFORMING



Listening — Respond to questions from a listening task—lecture or documents for interpretation and analysis.

Debate — Discussion style (minimum 2 players per team) or Lincoln-Douglas style. Limit one per five weeks.

Five-Minute Presentation
Limit one per five weeks.

Skit or Movie— Re-enact an historical event. Must be memorized script. 8 minutes minimum. 4 players maximum. Limit one per quarter. Grades may be different per participant depending on level and quality of participation.

Interview Test — Learn the material on a certain topic and have an interview with the teacher to show you know the material. Interview involves questions and discussion. 7-10 min.

WRITING



Document Based Question
Take home: Credit = **low**
By appt., no notes.

Persuasive Essay — Formulate an opinion on a controversy from history. Some research may be required.

Web Site — Design a web site on historical topic. Minimum 4 pages, site sources, images, etc.

Thematic Essay
Take home: Credit = **low**
By appt., no notes:Credit = **high**

Historical Fiction — Develop character and plot in a story set in history. Minimum size 3 pages double-spaced typed.

RULES
