Students are scheduled for Academic Intervention Services when they fall below the standards in a core subject area.

Our AIS lessons are an important part of the student’s weekly lessons. It is their “6th Social Studies Class” each week. More often than not, students earn credit for what we do.

Common AIS lessons include:

- Learning material for the next week’s regular class lesson in advance
- Skill work, particularly in developing reading skill, but also writing (how to write different types of essays, etc)
- NYS Test work, such as practice items from old NYS examinations
- Completing work that students were unable to complete in the regular class period when extended time is available for such activities

Although it is readily admitted that an extra 35 minutes of instruction falls short of what some students could use, it is an important time we want to use to its fullest.

This report is intended to share some basic information about the student’s work and behavior in AIS that parents may find useful.
